TECHNICAL ANNOUNCEMENT

1. GENERAL

The ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating consists of six international senior invitational events and the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final. All six events will be held with the approval and the assistance of the International Skating Union, under the responsibility of the Members concerned and in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2006 edition, the ISU Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating/Ice Dancing, 2006 edition, the Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2006 and the Technical Rules Ice Dancing 2006, and all relevant ISU Communications. As soon as the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2008 as well as the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dancing 2008 are published, the wording of the 2008 Regulations and Rules shall prevail.

The ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final belongs to the ISU and will be organized by the Korea Skating Union.

The six events and the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final are only open to Competitors who belong to an ISU Member and qualify with regard to eligibility according to ISU Constitutions and General Regulations Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in ISU Rule 108, paragraph 2.b) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirement in ISU Rule 109, and ISU Communication No. 1420 or any update of this Communication. Entries can only be made through the ISU Members.

Skaters/couples entered for an event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating may not participate in the same discipline of an event of the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating in the same season, except for Pairs. Only skaters participating in different disciplines with the exception of the Pair category may enter into both the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating and the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating in the same year/skating season.

No skater or couple may skate in the exhibition of an event or the Final without having participated in the event itself.

This regulation does not reflect any participation at the ISU Championships or any other international event not included in the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating or the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating.

For the 2008/09 season, the six events of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating are:

The ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final will be organized for the 6 best ranked Men, Ladies, Pairs and Ice Dance couples in:

Seoul, Republic of Korea

from December 10 to December 14, 2008

A point system within the six events of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating has been established to qualify the skaters for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final. Points will be obtained according to the results in each of the six events comprising the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating.

2. DESIGNATION OF THE SKATERS

2.1 Seeded Skaters/Couples

- a) Skaters/couples who have placed 1 6 in each of the 4 categories (Men, Ladies, Pairs, Ice Dance) at the most recent ISU World Figure Skating Championships will be considered to be seeded skaters/couples and will be assigned, by draw, to skate in two events.
- b) If a seeded skater/couple withdraws from an assigned event, even for medical reasons, that skater/couple will not be assigned to another event.
- c) If any vacancies remain after having filled the places as to a) to b) of this paragraph, the next priority will be given to those skaters/couples not meeting the above criteria but who have achieved a seasonal best (as posted on the ISU website for season 2007/2008) score equal to or better than the top six from the ISU World Figure Skating Championships 2008.
- d) If vacancies still remain after having filled the places as to a) to d) skaters/couples placed 7th and below at the ISU World Figure Skating Championships 2008 will become seeded skaters in order of placement.
- e) If a seeded skater/couple withdraws from one of the assigned events or declines an invitation to one of the assigned events, that skater/couple will still be considered and the next highest placed skater/couple at the most recent ISU World Figure Skating Championships will not become a seeded skater/couple.

2.2. Invited Skaters/Couples

- a) Skaters/couples who have placed 7 12 in each of the 4 categories (Men, Ladies, Pairs, Ice Dance) at the most recent World Championships will be guaranteed to be selected for two ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating events. If there are any retirements from placements 7 12, the next priority will be given to those skaters/couples not meeting the above criteria but who achieved a seasonal best score equal to or better than those placed 7 12 at the ISU World Figure Skating Championships 2008. If vacancies still remain, skaters/couples placed 13th and below at the ISU World Figure Skating Championships 2008 will be selected in order of placement.
- b) Skaters/couples with an ISU World Standing placement of 1 24 (after season 2007/2008) and skaters/couples with seasonal best scores in the top 24 (for season 2007/2008) who do not hold an ISU World Standing placement of 1 24 will be guaranteed one (1) event if they do not otherwise meet the criteria listed in categories 2.1 or 2.2 above.

A listing of seasonal best scores for each season will be compiled to include the following events:

- * ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating and Final
- ISU Senior Grand Prix of Figure Skating and Final
- * ISU Figure Skating Championships
- * Olympic Winter Games
- * Other ISU controlled Events as identified each season by the ISU Council
- c) Medallists from the ISU World Junior Figure Skating Championships and the medallists from the ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final will be included in the selection process. Skaters/couples who have stated their intention to skate as Senior in 2008/09 will be guaranteed one (1) event.
- d) A maximum of three (3) skaters/couples in each discipline from the host country may skate in the host Member's event. This includes skaters/couples selected according to category 2.1 and 2.2 above. If the host Member chooses to not exercise its option for the three (3) skaters/couples in any discipline from its own country, the remaining slot(s) must be filled from categories 2.2 a) and b) above.
- e) If any slot(s) remains open and if all skaters/couples as defined in paragraph 2.2. a) and b) above have been selected for one (1) event, the host country may select any skater/couple with a top 75 seasonal best score to fill the open slot(s).
- f) In addition to the seeded skaters/couples and the above-mentioned invited skaters/couples, each host ISU Member may select additional skaters/couples in accordance with selection procedures established by the ISU Figure Skating Event Coordination Group. The maximum number of entries per event, however, is set as follows:

- g) No invited skaters/dance couples may compete in more than two events of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating. These events will count for points and prize money will be awarded according to placements.
- h) New Pair combinations (new partner) with a top-ranked partner from previous year may be included into the Grand Prix Series as the "Host Member's Choice".
- i) A maximum of three skaters/couples from the same ISU Member may compete in the same category of any individual event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating.
- j) Non-seeded skaters/couples will not be assigned to another event if they choose not to skate in an assigned event.
- k) Non-seeded skaters/couples will not be assigned to another event if, by medical reason, they withdraw from an assigned event.

If a skater/couple (seeded or non-seeded) does not finish an event, that skater/couple's Member Federation is obligated to cover the expenses for travel, accommodation and meals for the skater/couple and for the judge, if the Judge is not drawn for another panel.

3. CONFIRMATION OF PARTICIPATION

3.1 Confirmation of Participation of Seeded Skaters/Couples

The ISU Members must confirm the participation of the seeded skaters/couples in the two events designated for points to the ISU Secretariat by **August 15**, **2008**. If a seeded skater/couple does not participate in the event(s) for which they are designated, there will be no substitute event(s).

3.2 Confirmation of Participation of Invited Skaters/Couples

The invitations for participation for skaters/couples, besides the seeded ones, will be forwarded to the ISU Members concerned through the host Member of the respective ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating event. The Members of these invited skaters/couples must confirm participation to the ISU Secretariat, and the host ISU Member by **August 15, 2008**.

3.3 Restrictions for Participation in Junior and Senior Grand Prix Events

Please refer to paragraph 1 of this announcement.

3.4 Obligation of seeded skaters/Members

It is of the highest importance that Rule 136 paragraph 6 of the ISU Regulations be respected and implemented by all Members and skaters. To assure compliance with Rule 136, paragraph 6, the following directive is issued by the ISU Council.

All seeded skaters/couples as to paragraph 2.1 of this General Announcement are categorized as "Seeded" skaters/couples and, as such, will be expected to participate in two (2) ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating individual events during the 2008/09 season. The Grand Prix events will take place from October 23, 2008 to December 1, 2008. ("the Grand Prix Period").

Seeded skaters/couples who fulfill their Grand Prix obligations may also skate in other competitions, shows and exhibitions as authorized by their Member during the Grand Prix Period and, for seeded skaters/couples who do not qualify for the Final, also in the period immediately following the last individual event (NHK Trophy).

If any seeded skater/couple elects in advance of the Grand Prix Period not to participate in their assigned events (for whatever reason), they will not be permitted to participate in any other competitions, shows, and exhibitions during the Grand Prix Period.

In addition, depending on the circumstances, the seeded skater/couple may be subject to sanctions in accordance with Rule 136, paragraph 6 of the General Regulations.

Seeded skaters/couples who agreed to participate in the Grand Prix Series and skaters who qualify for the Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final must skate in their assigned events and in the Final. Withdrawals are permitted only for illness or injury duly confirmed by a timely Medical Certificate as outlined below and subject to review by an ISU appointed Medical Doctor and/or for other justified serious reasons, such as e.g. bereavement in the close family.

In the case a Skater is withdrawn for injury or illness a Medical Certificate is required to be submitted to the ISU as per Rule 140, paragraph 5. The Certificate must be issued on the stationary of a Medical Doctor or on an ISU withdrawal form in case of in-competition withdrawal and duly signed by the Medical Doctor. If the certificate is not in English a translation signed by the President or General Secretary of the Member of respective Skater must be attached:

In addition, upon request of the Chair of the Sports Directorate the Certificate must be received by the ISU within 72 hours after the notice of withdrawal and the following information must be included or attached:

- i) the history which clearly indicates the date of injury or date of onset of illness, the type of injury or illness and severity of injury or illness as well as the physical findings on examination;
- ii) copies of laboratory or radiological reports that were conducted in the investigation of the injury/illness;
- the recommended treatment by the physician including medications, therapy, advice on training frequency and intensity, date for follow-up examination (a copy of this assessment should then be forwarded to the ISU), expected date of return to full activity, planned further investigations and/or criteria for return to full activity.

3.5 Restrictions for Participation in the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating and Open International Competitions

ISU Communication No. 1023, which remains in force, regarding the ISU principles for entries for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating and Open International Competitions shall apply.

3.6 Confirmation of Replacements with respect to Invited Skaters/Couples

All skaters/couples invited to replace assigned skaters/couples in an individual event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating must be approved by the ISU Figure Skating Event Coordination Group in accordance with the procedures outlined in Item 7.6

4. POINTS/RANKING ORDER

4.1 Points

A point system based on the ranking of each individual event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating is established as follows:

4.2 Points considered

The two results of a skater/couple as announced/confirmed will be used to calculate the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating ranking order. The points will be added to give a final total to determine the skater/couple's ranking for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating with the highest total being first.

4.3 Final Ranking Order

The ranking by points will be published immediately after the last event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating (for the 2008/09 season, the "NHK-Trophy"). The following will qualify for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final:

the top 6 ranking Men the top 6 ranking Ladies the top 6 ranking Pairs the top 6 ranking Ice Dance couples

4.4 Ties

If there is a tie by added points, the following criteria will be taken into consideration for tie-breaking:

a) the best place obtained in the two designated events will count for the better place/ranking;

If there is still a tie.

b) the higher total of the added total scores obtained in the designated events will count for the better place/ranking:

If there is still a tie,

c) participation in two events will be considered better than having participated in only one event;

If there is still a tie.

d) the higher total of the added scores in Free Skating/Free Dance obtained in the two designated events will count for the better place/ranking;

If there is still a tie,

e) the higher total score in Free Skating/Free Dance obtained in one of the two designated events will count for the better place/ranking;

If there is still a tie,

f) the higher total of the added scores in the Short Program/Original Dance obtained in the two designated events will count for the better place/ranking:

If there is still a tie.

g) the number of participants finishing the two individual events in which the tied skaters/couples have completed, will be added to the total. The higher number of participants will count for the better place/ranking.

If there is still a tie, all skaters tied are qualified for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final.

5. PRIZE MONEY FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL EVENT AND EXHIBITION FEE

All prize money in favour of the awarded skaters/couples will be paid at the end of each individual event through the hosting ISU Members and subsequently through the ISU Members of the awarded skaters/couples. Withholding tax, if any, will be deducted according to the respective law of the host ISU Member taking into account double tax treaties with the countries of the awarded skaters/couples. The ISU is not responsible for any taxes, fees, or other costs.

5.1 Prize Money for Each Individual Event

The Global Prize Money per individual event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating will be:

Skaters/couples qualified for the exhibition of an event or the Final must participate with an appropriate show number different from their competition programs. Failure to do so will result in a reduction of US\$ 3'000 from the awarded prize money.

Skaters/couples are expected to be ready for any ceremony and/or price award and participate in press conferences and/or social events if asked by the ISU and/or the event's Organizer. Failure to do so may result in a reduction of awarded prize money. The decision to reduce prize money will be made by the assigned ISU Delegate attending the event, subsequently to be ratified by the Council.

5.2 Exhibition Fee

An exhibition fee to be provided by the host Member will only be paid to skates/couples who are not awarded prize money. The exhibition fee is set at US\$ 200.00 for single skaters (Men and Ladies) and US\$ 300.00 for Pairs and Dance couples.

6. TECHNICAL DETAILS FOR THE INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

6.1 Technical Details

Free Skating In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Single and Pair Skating

Duration: 4 min., +/- 10 sec.

Pairs: Short Program The prescribed elements to be skated are those listed in ISU

Duration: max. 2 min., 50 sec., but may be less;

Original Dance

In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule 609 and all pertinent ISU Communications. The rhythm for the Original Dance is the

Rhythms and Dances 1920's, 1930's or 1940's

Any one or two rhythms/dances originated in the 1920's or 1930's or 1940's may be chosen (except Tango). If two rhythms are used one of them may be repeated. The program should reflect the original flavor and style of the decades mentioned above and NOT performed as a Ballroom Dance.

For general information concerning the rhythms (dances) which belong to the above mentioned decades please refer to the "Ice Dance Music Rhythms Booklet and Compact Disc 1995".

Variations of tempo within one selection of music are permitted. If only one rhythm /dance is chosen two different tunes of this rhythm may be used and which may differ in tempo.

Original orchestration of the music of the 1920's, 1930's or 1940's is not required. However, the orchestration must be in the style of the decade chosen.

Vocal music is permitted.

Duration: 2 minutes and 30 seconds (plus or minus 10 seconds)

Free Dance

In accordance with ISU Technical Rule Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule 610 and all pertinent ISU Communication. For the value of the required elements and components see the respective ISU Communication.

Duration: 4 min. +/- 10 sec.

ISU Technical Rules Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule 610 paragraph 2 (required elements) and the respective ISU Communication must be observed.

6.2 Starting order

In each individual Grand Prix event the participating skaters will be listed according to their ISU World Standing placement at the time of the event. The starting order in the Short Program or Compulsory Dance segment will be the reverse order of the ISU World Standing placements. In the case of any tie, there will be a draw to determine who skates first.

Skaters/couples, not having received any ISU World Standing points will be listed at the bottom of the ISU World Standing list in country order. There will be a separate draw between those skaters/couples with no World Standing points to determine the starting order, following the basic principles of ISU Rule 579.

For Free Skating/Original Dance/Free Dance the starting order will be the reverse order of the result after the previous segment.

7. MARKING SYSTEM / OFFICIALS / REPLACEMENTS

7.1 Marking System

The marking system as described in ISU Special Regulations Single and Pair Skating/Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule 352 and 353.

7.2 ISU Appointed Officials

The ISU will appoint all Officials (Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Assistant Technical Specialists) for each individual event and the Final in accordance with the 2006* Regulations.

^{*} ISU Regulations are subject to amendments as decided by the 2008 ISU Congress.

The ISU Secretariat will inform the Organizing Committees of the names of the Officials assigned to their Events. No changes will be accepted unless confirmed by the ISU Secretariat.

7.3 Panel of Judges

The panel of Judges in each individual event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating will consist of 10 Judges of different ISU Members in each discipline if possible, but not less than 8 Judges. Only International or ISU Judges who have participated in one of the ISU Seminars for the ISU Judging System are eligible to serve in the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating events and ISU Grand Prix of Skating Final. Each Judge may participate in no more than two ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating events plus the ISU Grand Prix of Skating Final.

7.4 Officials Remuneration

The Judges, the Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists, the Data and Replay Operators and the Officials Assessment Commission, will receive a remuneration in accordance with ISU Communication No. 1401, paragraph I (or any update of this Communication). Only hard currencies are acceptable. The remuneration should be paid upon accreditation.

7.5. Expenses

The Organizing Member will pay travel expenses based on economy airfare rate for all Competitors invited to its ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating event, for all Judges invited, for all Referees and for the appointed Technical Controllers from their domicile to the event and return. The travel expenses of the Technical Specialists, the Data and Replay Operators and the OAC Members are covered by the ISU.

The Organizing Member will pay accommodation and meal expenses for all Competitors, Judges, Referees, Technical Specialists, Technical Controllers and Data/Replay Operators from dinner on the day preceding the first official practice through breakfast on the day after the Exhibition. This period may be extended due to individual flight arrangements.

7.6 Replacements

It is mandatory that a host Member replaces any skater/couple who withdraws from the event with an alternate up to fourteen (14) days prior to the draw for that event. At the seven day mark, consideration will be given by the ISU Figure Skating Event Coordination Group to leaving a position vacant because of visa requirements or unduly high travel costs that would be incurred by the host country.

The alternate list will include the following skaters/couples:

- a) Any skater/couple with a top 24 seasonal best score (for season 2007/2008) (as defined in paragraph 2.1 and 2.2) for a second event.
- b) Any skater/couple with an ISU World Standing placement in the top 24 (at the end of season 2007/2008) for a second event.
- c) World Junior Championships/Junior Grand Prix Medallists not already selected for one (1) event.

Host Members may select these skaters/couples in any order.

d) Any skater/couple with a top seasonal best score (as defined in paragraph 2.1 and 2.2) of 75 or higher provided the priorities listed above have been exhausted.

In the skater/couple selection process, for Pairs and Ice Dance, who were placed amongst the ranks as mentioned above in the year 2006/2007 or 2007/2008, but have split, will be considered in the alternate list with the new partner, if proof is given that they intend to continue the competitive career.

* ISU Regulations are subject to amendments as decided by the 2008 ISU Congress.

8. ANTI-DOPING CONTROLS

Anti-Doping tests will be conducted at each of the six events of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating as well as at the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final.

The Anti-Doping tests will be conducted in accordance with the current ISU Anti-Doping Rules & Procedures (ISU Communications No. 1447 and 1448 or any further update of these Communications).

The ISU is not responsible for any taxes, fees or other costs.

Skaters/couples qualified for the exhibition of the Final must participate with an appropriate show number different from their competition programs. Failure to do so will result in a reduction of US\$ 5'000 from the awarded prize money (see also paragraph 9.10 below)

Skaters/couples are expected to be ready for any ceremony and/or price award and to participate in press conferences and/or social events if asked by the ISU and/or the event's Organizer. Failure to do so may result in a reduction of awarded prize money. The decision to reduce prize money will be made by the assigned ISU Delegate, subsequently to be ratified by the Council.

Duration: 4 min., +/- 10 sec.

Pairs: Short Program The prescribed elements to be skated are those listed in ISU

Duration: max. 2 min., 50 sec., but may be less;

Free Skating In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Single and Pair Skating

Duration: 4 min., 30 sec., +/- 10 sec.

Ice Dance: Original Dance In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule

609 and all pertinent ISU Communications. The rhythm for the Original Dance is the

Rhythms and Dances 1920's, 1930's or 1940's

Any one or two rhythms/dances originated in the 1920's or 1930's or 1940's may be chosen (except Tango). If two rhythms are used one of them may be repeated. The program should reflect the original flavor and style of the decades mentioned above and NOT performed as a Ballroom Dance.

For general information concerning the rhythms (dances) which belong to the above mentioned decades please refer to the "Ice Dance Music Rhythms Booklet and Compact Disc 1995".

Variations of tempo within one selection of music are permitted. If only one rhythm /dance is chosen two different tunes of this rhythm may be used and which may differ in tempo.

Original orchestration of the music of the 1920's, 1930's or 1940's is not required. However, the orchestration must be in the style of the decade chosen.

Vocal music is permitted.

Duration: 2 minutes and 30 seconds (plus or minus 10 seconds)

Free Dance In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule

610 and all pertinent ISU Communication. For the value of the required elements and components see the respective ISU

Communication.

Duration: 4 min. +/- 10 sec.

ISU Technical Rules Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule 610 paragraph 2 (required elements) and the respective ISU Communication must be observed.

9.3 Special Regulations for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final

Skaters/couples will start the Short Program/Original Dance in reverse order of the ranking order in which they have qualified for the Final. In the case of a tie, there will be a draw to determine who skates first. The skating order for the Free Skating/Free Dance portion is the reverse order of the ranking order in the Short Program or the Original Dance.

9.4 Marking System

The marking system as described in ISU Special Regulations Single and Pair Skating/Ice Dancing 2006*, Rule 352 and 353.

9.5 ISU Appointed Officials

The ISU will appoint all Officials (Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Assistant Technical Specialists, Data/Replay Operators) for the Final in accordance with the 2006* Regulations.

The ISU Secretariat will inform the Organizing Committee of the names of the Officials assigned to the Final. No changes will be accepted unless confirmed by the ISU Secretariat.

9.6 Panel of Judges

The panel of Judges will consist of 10 Judges of different ISU Members in each discipline, if possible, but not less than 8 Judges. Only ISU Judges, who have participated in one of the ISU Seminars for the ISU Judging System are eligible to serve in the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final. The invitations to the Judges will be issued by the ISU Secretariat.

9.7 Officials Remuneration

The Judges, the Referees, the Technical Controllers, the Technical Specialists, the Data and Replay Operators and the Officials Assessment Commission, will receive remuneration in accordance with ISU Communication No. 1401, paragraph I (or any update of this Communication). Only hard currencies are acceptable. The remuneration should be paid upon accreditation.

9.8 Ties

If two or more competitors (singles, pairs, ice dance) receive the same Segment Score, the Total Element Score will break the tie in the Short Program and the combined score of all 5 Program Components will break the tie in the Original Dance and in the Free Skating/Free Dance.

9.9 Entries

Confirmation of entries will be forwarded to the Member of the qualified skaters/couples by the ISU Secretariat. The official entry to the host Organizing Committee of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final must be forwarded by the respective Members using the official entry forms.

If a skater or couple cannot participate due to injury or illness, they must inform the Organizing Committee and the ISU Secretariat in writing through the respective ISU Member immediately so that the Organizing Committee can extend an invitation on behalf of the ISU to the next ranked skater/couple. The skater or couple will be required to forward a medical certificate to the ISU Secretariat in accordance with Item 11 below.

9.10 Exhibition

The top 4 placed skaters/couples of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final are expected to participate in the final Exhibition with an appropriate show number. Additional skaters/couples may also be invited to participate in the Exhibition. Encores are expected from the Gold Medallists. Skaters/Couples who fail to meet these requirements will have their prize money reduced by US\$ 5'000 in accordance with paragraph 9.1.

The final exhibition is a part of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final.

9.12 Expenses

The Organizing Member will pay travel expenses based on economy airfare rate for all Competitors qualified for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final, for all Judges invited (see paragraph 9.6), for all Referees and for the appointed Technical Controllers from their domicile to Seoul and return. The travel expenses of the Technical Specialists, the Data and Replay Operators and the OAC Members are covered by the ISU.

The Organizing Member will pay accommodation and meal expenses for all Competitors (senior final) from dinner on Wednesday, December 10, 2008 through breakfast on Monday, December 15, 2008. This period may be extended due to individual flight arrangements.

The Organizing Member will pay accommodation and meal expenses for all Judges, Referees and Technical Officials (Technical Specialists, Technical Controllers, Data/Video Operator, Swiss Timing Sport Service Gmbh (3 persons), Cameraman, etc... as indicated in cost chart) from dinner on Tuesday, December 9, 2008 through breakfast on Monday, December 15, 2008. This period may be extended due to individual flight arrangements.

9.13 Insurance / Liability

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in ISU Events, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means of the ill or injured person.

The ISU assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred by Competitors and Officials.

9.14 Travel Documents and Permits

Due to the limited time between the last event of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating (NHK-Trophy) and the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final, all qualified Team Members are requested to take care of their individual travel documents and permits (visa, etc.) on a timely basis.

10. REPLACEMENTS

10.1 Replacement for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final

A qualified skater/couple for the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final who is not able to participate will be replaced by the immediately following skater/couple, based on the Grand Prix ranking order of points.

The skaters/couples placed 7-9 on the Grand Prix ranking order of points must remain on stand-by as possible alternates until three days before the Opening of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final, i.e. until Monday, December 8, 2008 – noon local time Seoul / Korea. These skaters/couples are responsible for their own necessary visa or travel documents.

Replacements do not influence the invitation of Judges or the composition of the panel of Judges.

10.2 Decision for Replacements

The ISU Coordinator of the ISU Figure Skating Event Coordination Group will make the final determination of any replacements for the Final in accordance with paragraph 10.1

11. INJURIES OR ILLNESS OF TOP SEEDED SKATERS

In the case a Skater is withdrawn for injury or illness a Medical Certificate is required to be submitted to the ISU as per Rule 140, paragraph 5. The Certificate must be issued on the stationary of a Medical Doctor or on an ISU withdrawal form in case of in-competition withdrawal and duly signed by the Medical Doctor. If the certificate is not in English a translation signed by the President or General Secretary of the Member of respective Skater must be attached;

In addition, upon request of the Chair of the Sports Directorate the Certificate must be received by the ISU within 72 hours after the notice of withdrawal and the following information must be included or attached:

- i) the history which clearly indicates the date of injury or date of onset of illness, the type of injury or illness and severity of injury or illness as well as the physical findings on examination:
- ii) copies of laboratory or radiological reports that were conducted in the investigation of the injury/illness;
- the recommended treatment by the physician including medications, therapy, advice on training frequency and intensity, date for follow-up examination (a copy of this assessment should then be forwarded to the ISU), expected date of return to full activity, planned further investigations and/or criteria for return to full activity.

12. ANTI-DOPING

Anti-Doping tests will be conducted at each of the six events of the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating as well as at the ISU Grand Prix of Figure Skating Final.

The Anti-Doping tests will be conducted in accordance with the current with the current ISU Anti-Doping Rules & Procedures (ISU Communications No. 1447 and 1448 or any further update of these Communications).

The tests will be carried out on the winning skater/s in Singles (after the final Free Skating), Pair Skating (after the Free Skating) and Ice Dance (after the Free Dance). One skater from the remainder of the skaters shall be selected by random draw in Singles, Pair Skating and Ice Dance. In Pair Skating and Ice Dance, either the man or the lady, but not both, shall be tested and shall be selected by random draw.
